As a typical member of the national philanthropic community, Chunhui Children's Foundation ("Chunhui Children" or "the Foundation" for short) has always been part of its endeavor to make the country a better place for all the needy. With growing social support and engagement, the Foundation established years ago to help China's most vulnerable children, begins to burgeon. Since day one, it has been striving to build itself into an efficient, transparent and trustworthy organization that helps bring consistent professional care to orphaned and left-behind children deprived of family love. Today, we have moved beyond our individual efforts to cooperate closely with charitable organizations, government administrations, loving companies and the general public in helping our country forge ahead in children's welfare.

Caring for the disadvantaged and pursuing professionalism is an important part of modern philanthropy and also a core value of Chunhui Children. Targeting underprivileged children in China who are in urgent need of emotional support and professional loving care, Chunhui Children keeps bringing in internationally cutting–edge child development philosophy, concepts, best practices, and program operations and management models. Up till now, Chunhui has run child care and education programs in 104 welfare institutions and 46 villages of the country. 65 percent of child welfare institutions in China have cooperated with Chunhui Children or received its training. Now, the Chinese government consistently invests in children's welfare, and steps up efforts in fee-for-service programs with social organizations so that they can help optimize public services with their best resources. In 2018, Chunhui Children maintained close cooperation with civil affairs administrations and welfare institutions. It contracted with partner institutions to provide training and program set-up services as required.

Benevolence is a powerful social force. In 2018, Chunhui Children took big strides in fundraising. It received 13 million public donations totalling RMB 23.8 million. Also we made consistent efforts in governance and management to make our Foundation more transparent, efficient and professional. In September, Chunhui Children was rated as one of China's Top Trustworthy Charities (19th in the rank), China's first charity credit list released by Institute for Philanthropy Tsinghua University (IPTU).

Introduction of Chunhui Children

Chunhui Children was registered in Beijing in 2012 and was granted public fundraising status in 2017. We recruit front-line caregivers and teachers and train them to provide consistent family-like love and science-based, child-centered education for orphaned children in welfare institutions and for children left behind by migrant parents in rural areas. In 2015, Chunhui Children received a 5A social organization status and was awarded the title of "Pioneer Social Organization" for 2015-2017. At present, Chunhui Children runs three core programs for children in welfare institutions and children left behind in rural areas. The three programs are: Chunhui Mama, Chunhui Care Home and Chunhui Village.

Transparency

1. Foundation Transparency Index (FTI)— a quota devised by the China Foundation Center and Tsinghua University to measure an organization's performance in disclosing information to the public. It consists of 41 sub-indices concerning basics, financial and program information of the organization. By December 6, 2018, 5,694 foundations had been rated by the FTI selection, and Chunhui Children was one of the 213 that received a full score.

2. On the morning of September 3, 2018, a press conference was held in Tsinghua University to mark the release of the China's Top Trustworthy Charities of 2018, China's first charity credit list. 60 organizations were selected to be the top trustworthy ones, and Chunhui Children ranked the 19th among them.

Revenue and Expenditure

1. 2018 Expenditure Composition

The total expenditure was RMB 46,674,357.64, a slight increase over the year earlier. Business activity expenses rose by 15%, mostly on Chunhui Care Home.



2.2018 Revenue Composition

The total revenue was RMB 57,673,638.00, a year-on-year jump of 36%, 57,438,016.03 of which came from donations. Crowd-funding grew by 93%, and Chunhui Night by 30%. The detailed composition is as follows.

In recent years, we have admitted dozens of children, from newborns to 6 year olds, with a variety of complicated conditions. He received the Distinguished Service Award and the Lifetime Achievement Award from Joint Council for International Children's Services and the Harry Holt Award from Holt International. He serves on the Board of Directors of the Joint Council on International Children's Services, Half the Sky Foundation and SPOON Foundation.

Professor Wei Guorong is a senior physiotherapist. She earned her Master Degree in Disability Studies from London University and Master of Medicines from Hebei Medical University. With some 30 years' experience in rehabilitation service. Wei has a number of publications, engaged in the design and evaluation of multiple major domestic and international rehabilitation programs, and participated in many international academic conferences. She served as sports therapy director of Hebei General Hospital, early intervention director of Malaysia Center for Spastic Children, senior rehabilitation consultant and academic director of Hong Kong Society for Rehabilitation, academic leader and director of child rehabilitation teaching and research office, Hebei Medical University. She's also member of the Physiotherapist Certification Committee and Child Rehabilitation Committee of Chinese Association of Rehabilitation Medicine, and National Teaching Instruction Committee of Civil Affairs Vocational Education. She is now working as Senior Rehabilitation Director at Chunhui Children.

Program Philosophy

In June 1994, UNESCO convened the World Conference on Special Needs Education and adopted *The Salamanca Statement*, which first proposed inclusive education. The statement proclaims, "Every child has unique characteristics, interests, abilities and learning needs. Education systems should be designed and educational programs implemented to take into account the wide diversity of these characteristics and needs."

Inclusive education is an educational philosophy that does not exclude, discriminate against or classify any children, and requires teachers to recognize and respond to their diverse needs. To this day, all of Chunhui Children's programs continue to follow the concept of inclusive education, responding to each child's needs and caring about the quality of each child's life. The programs are combined with three core program principles—responsive care, secure attachment and enriching learning environment. Chunhui Children develops its inclusive education teaching methods based on early childhood development, creating equal educational opportunities that are appropriate for each child and responsive to each child's individual needs in overall practice and learning.

Professional Development Report

While delivering our programs we continuously work to improve the professionalism of program staff as well as monitor and upgrade program quality. All those concerned, including front-line staff, trainers and institution administrators, are involved in this pursuit of better programs.

Our commitments in 2018 were as follows:

Site Visits

In 2018, Chunhui trainers conducted 327 visits in 56 welfare institutions in partnership with the Chunhui Mama program for follow-up, monitoring, and on-site training.

Evaluation

In 2018, we upgraded our internal evaluation system into an easy-to-operate system with a package of more scientific, improved, standardized and upgraded tools, and delivered internal program evaluation to 31 welfare institutions in partnership with the Chunhui Mama program.

Internal evaluation was delivered to 3 welfare institutions through the Chunhui Mama program.

Curricula

Partnering with Shanghai University of Sport and under the guidance of Professor Wu Xueping and her team, Chunhui Children completed and put into use the curriculum Elementary Adapted PE Courses for Children and Youth with Special Needs. In addition, drawing on the experience of front-line staff, we developed Q&A on the Care and Rehabilitation Basics of Children with Special Needs, a practical guide for the program teachers.



Training

In 2018, we held six large intensive training workshops, one for trainers, two for those working with Chunhui Infant Nurture and Preschool, one for youth mentors, one for sports teachers, and one for those engaged in inclusive education. These sessions focused on games and child rehabilitation, responsive cycle in infant activities, adult learning based on brain activity rules, coaching skills practice, adaptive PE classes and inclusive education.

Seven large training sessions took place in the Early Learning and Training Center of Ye County, four for Family Skills program, admitting 300 mentors, and three for the Preschool program, admitting 400 teachers. The training covered the new courses and hands-on practices. In addition, family mentors from 43 villages made it to sessions that helped consolidate their professional knowledge and hands-on skills in March, June and August. All these systematic training helped the teachers better apply what they learned into practice.

Program Overview

The 2017 Social Service Development Communique indicates that by the end of 2017, the number of orphaned children in China had reached 410,000, of which 86,000 spent their days under institutional care. The national survey into rural left-behind children led by the Ministry of Civil Affairs, the Ministry of Education and the Ministry of Public Security found that, by the end of March 2016, there had been 9.02 million left-behind children under the age of 16. At present, Chunhui Children serves institutional children and left-behind children in poverty-stricken rural areas.

By the end of 2018, Chunhui Children's footprint had covered 30 provinces, autonomous regions and municipalities and accumulatively served 170,000 children in total. Chunhui Mama program had been set up in 104 welfare institutions benefiting a total of over 150,000 children. Chunhui Village program had reached 17,000 rural left-behind children, and Chunhui Care Home 2,773 children with life-threatening diseases.

In 2018 alone, 12,000 children benefited from Chunhui Mama program, 290 children benefited from Chunhui Care Home program, and 13,052 children benefited from Chunhui Village program. In addition. After completing partnership with Chunhui Children and introduction to Chunhui approach, 55 welfare institutions have been independently running Chunhui-inspired programs which, with the consistent efforts of 900 staff members, have benefited 4,500 orphaned children.

2018 was the first year of our five-year plan. We wish to consolidate social resources and bring Chunhui Mama program to a leading institution in each province, autonomous region or municipality. Our goal is to develop these sites into model centers with the highest level of program quality, and empower them to train and support local secondary institutions in operating Chunhui Mama program so more children could be served. 2018 was a good start towards our five-year plan. Four model centers in Liaoning, Yunnan, Jiangxi and Jiangsu provinces trained four secondary institutions in Dalian, Quijing, and Ji'an and Nantong respectively, which altogether set up 8 sub-programs enrolling 139 children. This helped develop competent leading staff for local institutions.

Over all these years, Chunhui programs have been well accepted by welfare institutions. In 2016, Chunhui Children started a fee-for-service program with some of them. In 2018, 16 institutions procured Chunhui Children's training and program set-up services.

Caring women with appropriate professional backgrounds from the local community are recruited and trained to become full-time "Chunhui Mamas" who provide loving responsive care for orphaned babies and toddlers from birth to 3 years old and form secure attachments with them. "Chunhui Mamas" pay close attention to each child's needs, celebrate their progress no matter how minor, and provide timely, appropriate responses to their needs. They also provide vital brain stimulation, including a variety of age-appropriate games to promote their physical, language, cognitive and social-emotion-al development.

Chunhui Preschool serves children aged 3-7 in welfare institutions by providing supportive environments, individualized classes based on each child's developmental levels and interests, and professionally trained early education teachers who use the concept of responsive care in the curriculum. Chunhui Preschool is designed to promote children's physical, language, cognitive, and social-emotional development, help them develop a love for learning, and prepare them for elementary or special education schools.

Trained loving mentors spend time with children and young adults aged 7-18 to learn about their needs and interests, give them necessary emotional support, and develop individualized learning plans for each of them based on their characteristics and interests. The plan may include academic tutoring, enrichment classes based on their interests or vocational training. The program helps children develop self-awareness and build confidence and self-esteem. Chunhui Children's goal is to help these children understand that they too can have big dreams and that we will support them as they pursue their dreams.

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Families have always been the best way we have to raise our young children. The Chunhui Family program recruits married couples from the local community who receive our professional training and then set up loving foster homes for children with special needs who for the first time have the opportunity to grow up with familial love. Each family includes a trained full-time mom and a working dad who take care of 3-5 children who are unlikely to be adopted. The families live in apartments provided by the welfare institutions.

This program is for orphaned children in welfare institutions who have some sports skills but are precluded by their special physical needs from entering a local school. Teachers with special education training use adaptive physical education to build up the children's health, improve their self-care skills and enhance their physical fitness, while enabling them to enjoy the fun of sports by bringing them outdoors. This program is designed for welfare institutions' children with the most severe special needs. We believe all children, regardless of their disabilities, are entitled to developmentally appropriate education. Working closely with the institutions, we use their existing facilities and pool as many rehabilitation, special education, nutrition, medical care and professional treatment resources as we can to develop individualized support plans that provide the best possible opportunities to develop and improve the children's physical health, cognitive and social-emotional skills and quality of life.









To meet the pressing needs of welfare institutions for quality child care and to ultimately reach more orphaned children in need, Chunhui Children delivers both on-site and online training for institution administrators, caregivers, teachers and foster parents in welfare institutions.

Program Story The Angel on a Wheelchair

Lili, born with polio, was abandoned by her biological parents when she was very young. She is a girl who speaks gently and softly. But, unluckily, each step she takes in her life has to be with a wheelchair.

She met her Chunhui Mama in the spring of 2014 when she was 22 years old. She could not understand Mandarin, either reading or writing.

Lili mastered writing and reading under Chunhui Mama's endless help for two years.

In 2015, with Chunhui Children's support, Lili started her "handcraft room" to teach young adults to make crafts.

Lili is also a lucky girl because she has been filled with Chunhui Mama's love and she knows how love feels like and how to love others. She tastes happiness and also knows how to bring happiness to others.

"Chunhui Mama pours me love and I'll pass it by to love each brother and sister like me," said Lili.

Chunhui Care Home (CCH) partners with welfare institutions in China to bring infants and toddlers born with life-threatening diseases and birth defects to Beijing to provide them with the best medical care available. Working with the institutions and China's top hospitals, CCH covers all areas of the children's medical treatment including pre-operative check, hospitalization, surgery and other care. In partnership with the Tomorrow Plan, administered by the Ministry of Civil Affairs, the program each year serves more than 200 children fighting for their lives. We train full-time loving Chunhui Mamas to patiently provide the best possible follow-up care and emotional support so the children can recover, return to the institutions and, whenever possible, find a permanent adoptive family at the earliest possible date.

Program Story The Story of Xiaodi

Xiaodi was found by the side of a road and then taken to a welfare institution. This tiny little boy, months old, came to people's notice with his centipede-like cleft.

The medical term for his condition is cleft lip and palate.

During his first days in CCH, he had severe problems in eating. Even if he was fed the smallest amounts of food from the corner of his mouth with a specially designed spoon, he would still spill them out.

His surgery lasted five hours and it kept his Chunhui Mama to wait with overwhelming anxiety. The moment he was pushed out of the surgery room on a wheeled stretcher, face swollen with dense stitches under his nose, she cried her eyes out.

Xiaodi cried bitterly, and to prevent his wounds from bursting apart, his Chunhui Mama cradled him in her arms, all the time. The boy nestled on her shoulder and calmed down, the dribble mixed with blood running out of his mouth and coloring her shoulder red.

Deep down in her heart, she believed Xiaodi is strong and would get over this, whatever may come.

Xiaodi proved her right. He recovered quickly. Three days after the surgery, he ate normally. On day seven, he visited the doctor for his stitches to be removed. His surgeon was overjoyed to see his little repaired mouth, perfect in his eyes.

People say miracles only happen in fairy tales. But Chunhui miracles are everywhere around us.





Chunhui Village Program — Village Model

- A Improves Skills of Child Caregivers
- A Promotes Holistic Early Development of Rural Left-behind Children

Chunhui Village is an early childhood development program specially designed for rural left-behind children aged 0-18 and their caregivers. It allows children to develop as individuals, and centers on their interests and needs. By putting together the resources of families, schools and communities, we set up Children's Centers that provide family skills training, home visits and community engagement opportunities. We are committed to creating a nurturing community environment that helps unleash the children's fullest potential and fuels their physical, language, cognitive, and social-emotional development.







Program Story I Miss You as Much as You Miss Me

Ever since she was born, Yinmeng has been a child dying for parental care. When she was one, her parents migrated to Shanghai for work, and she never met them until she was five.

When she was first enrolled in the Chunhui Village program, the poorly dressed girl of few words caught our attention. She shook her head without any expression when asked if she missed her parents. She had no idea what she had missed out on, and with parents away from home she knew so little about family love.

Her preschool teacher paid her special attention. She started to help her develop self-care skills by buying her toiletries. Now, she has learned to wash, do simple laundry, and tidy clothes up. She looks neat and pretty. She joined one of our interest-developing classes where she has learned to draw, bonded with the teachers and made friends. She began to open up and her academic performance was improving.

To build up the communication between Yinmeng and her parents, her preschool teachers often text them about her school performances. This regular sharing between them helps Yinmeng better understand her parents who, in turn, begin to trust the teachers.

Long distance loving attention has paid off. At eight years of age, Yinmeng went to Shanghai where she enjoyed, for the first time, some much-expected sweet time with her parents.

This is life, isn't it? It is full of miracles. Like a tossed stone stirring a thousand ripples, this opportunity to stay with her parents transformed her. Back from Shanghai, she would still sit on the sofa, but when she raises her head and smiles, she looks happy and affectionate. And when speaking of her parents now, her eyes tear up and she will say she misses them, because her mother tells her "I miss you as much as you miss me".

Crowd Fundraising

In 2018, Chunhui Children partnered with seven online charity platforms on campaigns during the Spring Festival, Mother's Day, 95 Philanthropy Week and 99 Giving Day. With support from loving companies and celebrities, we received 13,140,000 donations totaling more than RMB 23,800,000, a sharp rise over the previous year. To acknowledge the donors, we scheduled program site visits for them, which helped them learn more about our programs and was highly recognized by our partner platforms.









Funding from Corporations and Foundations



In 2018, with cooperation from dozens of corporations and foundations, Chunhui Children raised RMB 25 million. As a part of their CSR, they supported us by donating proceeds from products sales for charity purposes, and by facilitating employee crowd funding and time with us. Their wonderful staff participated in walkathons for us and volunteered at "You Are My Family " Chunhui Night. All along these loving campaigns, they never forgot to advocate our program concepts to the wider public.

Chunhui Nights are annual fundraising events started in 2013 to help China's most vulnerable children. Since it was launched, it has won strong support from celebrities, and until now a total of RMB 30 million has been raised.

On October 20, the 2018 "You Are My Family" Chunhui Night was staged in Beijing Crand Millennium Hotel. 300 participants including corporate executives, leaders and celebrities gathered together to help raise funds to provide loving attention to the children. The 39 live auction items including artworks, jewelries and luxuries and 64 silent auction items, program donations and sales of charitable products altogether raised more than RMB 6 million, a new record amount that will help bring loving care of Chunhui Mamas to more children in need.
