

### Revenue and Expenditure


### ¥ 2019 Revenue Composition

The total revenue in 2019 was RMB 70,780,564.33, an increase by 23% over the year earlier. RMB 70,520,782.41 of the total came from donations. Gala revenue recorded the most rapid increase. The 2019 total revenue and donation income are as follows:



### 2019 Expenditure Composition

The total expenditure in 2019 was RMB 62,178,993.83, a slight increase over the previous year. Program cost saw a year-on-year increase of 34%, mostly on the Chunhui Village Program.

Zhao Wen, Ph.D., Chief Program Officer, China

Zhao Wen holds a Master Degree in Family and Childhood Education from the University of Wyoming and a Ph.D. in Early Childhood Studies from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. Her teaching experience includes preschool teaching at Head Start in Wyoming and the lab school at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, university teaching in the United States, and teacher training in China. As early as in the 1990's, Wen began her research on best care practices for orphans living in institutions in China while she was teaching at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. He serves on the editorial boards of Adoption Quarterly and Adoptive Families Magazine and has authored over 200 scholarly works. He received the Distin-Lifetime Achievement Award from Joint Council for International Children' s Services and the Harry Holt Award from Holt International. ### Program Philosophy

All of Chunhui Children's programs follow the philosophy of inclusive education. Believing in lifelong management of the whole child, they focus on each child's development in all areas, accept children with all levels of special needs, and care about the needs and life quality of each child served by their programs. The programs are combined with three core principles—responsive care, secure attachment and an enriching learning environment. Chunhui Children develops its courses inclusive of all program children based on their early development, creating equal educational opportunities that are appropriate for each child and responsive to each child's individual needs.




#### Secure Attachment








Program evaluation form for Chunhui Village

### Professional Development Report

While running our programs we continuously work to improve the professionalism of program staff and keep program quality at the highest level. All those concerned, including front-line staff, trainers and institution administrators, are involved in this pursuit of better programs.

### Training

In 2019, five major intensive training sessions were rolled out, covering blended learning, inclusive education in Chunhui families, sports evaluation theory and practices. application of rehabilitation and sports in infant activities, rehabilitation and preschool integration. The

In 2019, 32 NTP sessions were provided for front-line program staff from welfare institutions, including:

### Five-Year Plan

2019 was the second year of our five-year plan, and we will continue to build close relationships with welfare institutions. We'll optimize social resources and Chunhui's expertise, with the aim of spreading Chunhui Mama Program all over the country, in the forms of empowerment, seeds and fee-for-service. Our goal is to keep improving program quality, push forward inclusive education and help the children in welfare institutions achieve great progress in all developmental areas.

Moreover, we have established closer cooperation with provincial civil affairs offices. Program training, child evaluation and risk assessment of welfare institutions' operations have enabled us to meet the varied needs of institutions while gaining valuable experience in program management.

Also, in 2019, we duplicated Beijing Care Home in Shanghai, giving more children with life-threatening diseases from welfare institutions in southern China easier access to medical care. In addition, in partnership with local civil affairs administrations, Chunhui Village Program was expanded to ten more villages to help create nurturing communities for more children left behind.

Operated by Chunhui Children in state-run welfare institutions, Chunhui Mama is a child care and education program designed for orphaned and special needs children aged 0-18. This comprehensive program adheres to the concept of Chunhui Children's inclusive education, takes into account the developmental characteristics of children at different ages, integrates the responsive and inclusive education curriculum of rehabilitation and special education, and designs individualized teaching content and methods, thus creating educational opportunities suitable for each child and promoting their holistic development. The program trains thousands of front-line Chunhui Mamas to provide responsive care for orphaned children, develop needs. In doing so, the children can thrive in family-like love and care. Chunhui Mama is not only a name for one of our programs but also the title for the thousands of women working with our programs in welfare institutions. They serve two roles, as the children's "mamas," and as their teachers. There are seven sub-programs in Chunhui Mama, including Chunhui Infant Nurture, Chunhui Preschool, Chunhui Youth, Chunhui Sports, Chunhui Rehabilitation and Special Education, Chunhui Family



The Destinations of My Life Chunhui Mama Yang Xiaojuan



My name is Yang Xiaojuan. Before working as a Chunhui Mama, I had been to many places, both at home and abroad. I enjoyed seeing the world and looking for new destinations, until one day I joined Chunhui Children, and before I realized I was bonded with a group of forgotten children. Then it hit me that Chunhui was my perfect next destination. I became a Chunhui Mama, providing the children with all the love they need to thrive.

Yunyun was 6 months old. She was beautiful, but if you give her a little extra attention you will find that she had severe atrophy in her legs and myelomeningoeele. I worked really hard to take care of her. She was fragile with a poor bladder, so I gave her massages to ease her pain, much more intense pain than we could ever imagine.

Yunyun was born deprived, and she need someone to guide her through darkness to the light, to her own destinations. Am I good enough to be that person, using my own life to impact another?

To be up to this job, I learned a variety of child care approaches. Routines were established for Yunyun and she began to change.

One early morning, the 1-year-old girl was learning to walk. Her legs failed her, and she kept falling and crying. My heart was broken and I wanted to pick her up. Then I thought of what I learned about responsive care. I need to observe and interpret her needs before offering what is best for her.

I held back from reaching out my hands and asked: "Yunyun, Mama is here. What do you want?"

Yunyun pointed at me with a finger, saying: "I walk ... I walk ..."

"Come here, come to my arms!" I said.

Yunyun hobbled towards me, and then threw herself into my arms.

We laughed heartily.

When Yunyun was almost two, she was adopted. That day, while she was asleep, I let her go.

It's been 17 years, and I have mothered 21 children. I show each of them that no matter how many challenges wait ahead, follow the right path and you will get closer to happiness.

"Are you tired of caring for so many children?" I was once asked. It is hard work. But, whatever happens, I will take them to their next destinations.

Chunhui Care Home (CCH) partners with welfare institutions in China to bring infants and toddlers born with life-threatening diseases and birth defects to Beijing and Shanghai to provide them with the best medical care available. Working with the institutions and China's top hospitals, CCH covers all areas of the children's medical treatment including pre-operative check, hospitalization, surgery and other care. In partnership with the Tomorrow Plan, administered by the Ministry of Civil Affairs, the program each year serves more than 200 children fighting for their lives. We train full-time loving Chunhui Mamas to patiently provide the best follow-up care and emotional support so the children can recover, return to the institutions and find a permanent adoptive family at the earliest possible date.



I Have a Loving Chunhui Mama
Chunhui Care Home Yi

My name is Yi. I am seven. I remember that since I was very little my "home" has been different from others. There were lots of kids, uncles and aunties around every day.

Suffering from bilateral dislocation of hip joint, I hobbled and wobbled when walking, an "ugly duck-ling" in the eyes of my peers. How I wished I could walk and dance, as freely as other kids.

In October of 2018, I came to Beijing, I was nervous all the way. I had no idea where I would be taken. Finally, I settled down in a place called Chunhui Care Home. It was clean and nice, many nannies were giving loving care to little babies, different from what I had expected.

I was put under the care of a nanny. She greeted me smilingly and told me I could address her as "Mama". As scheduled, I had to stay in my "new home" for a month before the planned surgery. So, I started my days with "explorations". Day in and day out, bit by bit, I came to know this wonderland.

My new home was beautiful and bustling with excitement. It was more spacious and warmer than my previous home. Here, I had my own room and crib. My little roommates all looked happy.

My Mama told me that some of the children had been here for months, and the others for years. They all think of this place as their home.

My first surgery (left leg) was scheduled in November of 2018. My new Mama spent all her time by my side, doing everything possible to meet my needs, no matter how unreasonable they seemed.

After the surgery, I was taken back to the ward. Both my leg and waist were cast and I had to freeze most of the time. Confined to the bed, I stared at the ceiling, upset and irritated. And I grew attached to my new Mama.

In April 2019, my right leg surgery was completed. It was successful and then, after staying in the hospital for over a month. I returned to CCH and started to try walking.

In the earliest days, I was afraid of taking steps. My Mama held my arms and kept encouraging me. Once I took my first steps, though still unsteady, I was motivated to try many more. Months later, I was walking without orthopedic shoes. It was the first time I had walked independently on a road of Beijing, and it felt awesome.

This, however, meant that I had to leave CCH, leave my Mama.

In July 2019, the last day I was in CCH, it was sunny. I held the hands of my Mama, and she hugged me, so tight. Tears streamed down our faces, for so long.

 Model for Left-behind Children—
 Improves Skills of Child Caregivers
 Promotes Holistic Early Development of Rural Left-behind Children Chunhui Village is an early childhood development program specially designed for rural left-behind children and their caregivers. It focuses on the early learning and development of children, aged 0-6, responding to their needs and interest, and allowing them to develop in their own ways. By putting together the resources of families, schools and communities, we set up Children's Centers that provide family skills training, reading and community engagement opportunities. We are committed to creating a nurturing community environment that helps unleash the children's fullest potential and fuels their physical, language, cognitive, and social-emotional development. The program also addresses the needs of children and adolescents, aged 7-18. It provides them with interest development, games, reading and learning opportunities in a safe environment that helps them develop their own hobbies, builds self-esteem and confidence while improving abilities to build relationships and adapt. By home visiting and following up on children with special needs, it offers them extra necessary support.



A Little Girl Who No Longer Plays Alone
Chunhui Village Program Xiao Zhen

In a corner of the activity room in her rural village in China, 5-year-old Zhenzhen sat alone, quietly playing by herself. She watched as other children laughed and played together, but they all stayed away.

The first time Chunhui trained mentor Ms. Jin saw the lonely child, she noticed that the little girl's clothes were soiled and that she seemed unkempt. Filled with sympathy for the child and believing that her disheveled appearance was keeping the other children away, Ms. Jin sat down on the floor, and began to play with her. Soon after, she decided to pay her a home visit.

When Ms. Jin knocked on the front door of the little girl's house, she was greeted by Zhenzhen, who answered the door, smiling shyly, her dad standing behind her. As Ms. Jin entered the house, she could see it was in disarray.

She learned that Zhenzhen lives with her parents and three siblings. Her mom is developmentally delayed and can only do limited housework. Her dad is the breadwinner in the family. He struggles to make a living by cultivating some farmland. Apart from harvest seasons, he does odd jobs with the village's construction team. But recent back problems had forced him to take time off. He was having a hard time keeping up with the children's needs.

During the home visit, Ms. Jin encouraged Zhenzhen's mother Yanling to establish daily routines and help the children get in the habit of washing their faces and brushing their teeth. "They can learn to do those things on their own," Ms. Jin told Yanling, "Besides that, make sure they have on clean and neat clothes each day. That will help them feel comfortable and confident."

Ms. Jin urged Zhenzhen' s parents to send her to the village's communal Children's Center as often as possible, so that she could take part in more group activities that are good for her development and would help her socialize more with the other kids, Ms. Jin even offered to pick up Zhenzhen herself if her dad was too busy.

"Thank you, Ms. Jin," said Zhenzhen' s dad. "We are very willing to take your advice. It' s a good thing to let her learn and gain more knowledge and skills," Yanling, too, nodded in agreement and seemed to really trust the Chunhui mentor.

From then on, Ms. Jin visited Zhenzhen's home frequently to provide follow-up and encouragement on Zhenzhen's behalf. She continued to teach her parents how to focus on their children's needs and give responsive care.

Soon when Zhenzhen came to the Children's Center, her clothes were clean. She had become more confident and secure. In fact, she made many friends and was always smiling! She even led the other children in games and loved it when her friends followed and imitated her.

During a recent home visit, Ms. Jin told Zhenzhen' s parents about all her progress. And she was pleasantly surprised to find out that Zhenzhen had been making progress at home as well; not just washing her face and brushing her teeth, but being more polite.

"Now Zhenzhen has become much more thoughtful," her father told Ms. Jin. "She immediately apologized to her sister after arguing with her. I asked her who taught her to say 'sorry' and 'thank you' and she said it was you. I can' t thank you enough for teaching her so well!"




