

In early 2020, the COVID-19 pandemic broke out, dealing massive blows to lives and health of our people. Social and economic development was confronted with unprecedented challenges. Joining in the national endeavor to fight against the pandemic, Chunhui Children developed internal prevention and control plans and took effective counter measures at the earliest possible time.

Right after the pandemic, Chunhui Children's partner welfare institutions were in dire need of supplies and disinfectants. Chunhui Children immediately learned about their needs and, against all odds, managed to procure materials with a total value of RMB 1,500,000 for 260 welfare institutions and relief stations. The materials included 300,000 masks, 35,000 disposable gloves, and 521 barrels of disinfectant. Chunhui Children's staff members in charge, via hundreds of thousands of phone calls and messages, ensured the materials were successfully delivered. The timely support from Chunhui Children motivated the institutions to win the battle against the pandemic.







Since it was founded in 2012, Chunhui Children has always stood steadfast in all its commitments and stayed in tune with the best interests of children. In early 2020 when the COVID-19 pandemic swept across China, it rose to the challenge and stepped up to give the children it serves full loving protection.

It was around the 2020 Spring Festival (Chinese Lunar New Year). Requests from Chunhui Children's partner welfare institutions for anti-pandemic supplies poured in. The moment Chunhui Children received these requests, it appropriated a special fund of RMB 1 million+ and delivered 300,000 masks and dozens of barrels of disinfectant to more than 200 welfare institutions, rescue stations, and protection centers for the minors. The Ministry of Civil Affairs sent a thank-you letter acknowledging Chunhui Children's support and contribution to the zero positive case records in all welfare institutions across China.

The pandemic held back Chunhui Children's offline fundraising events, program operations, and donor visits. In 2020, our program training, site visits and gala night, an annual event that had previously been hosted for seven years in a row, all moved online. With these new explorations, Chunhui Children transformed challenges into opportunities and turned away from passive changes to self-driven innovations.

Despite the raging pandemic, Chunhui Children kept forging

ahead. For the Foundation, 2020 was a very fruitful year. Its achievements included the "5A Social Organization" status, special consultative status with the Economic and Social Council, United Nations, "China Charity Award" and full transparency marks scored by China Foundation Center's FIT2020.

More excitingly, Chunhui Children expanded its programs to at-risk children. Many of these vulnerable children were exposed to trauma in their early years of life. They need at least one caring adult in their life, to love them, accept them, and nurture them back where they should be. This is where Chunhui Children comes in. It brings to these children full-time social workers who, equipped with Chunhui-inspired professional skills, provide support that these children need to thrive.

The supreme good is like water, benefiting all creation without trying to compete with it. Chunhui Children will always stay true to its original aspirations. "We'll never stop until each child has a loving adult in his/her life." This is our vision and also our invariable motivation.


Chunhui Children was registered in Beijing in 2012 and was granted public fundraising status in 2017. It recruits front-line caregivers and teachers and trains them to provide consistent family-like love and science-based, child-centered education for orphaned children in welfare institutions and for children left behind by migrant parents in rural areas. In 2015 and 2020, Chunhui Children won a 5A status, the highest level, in the five-year Beijing social organization evaluation and was awarded special consultative status with the Economic and Social Council, UN. At present, Chunhui Children runs three core program models for children in welfare institutions and left-behind children in rural areas. The three programs are Chunhui Mama, Chunhui Care Home and Chunhui Village.





2020 Revenue Composition


The total revenue in 2020 was RMB 72,613,937.32, an increase of 3% over the previous year. RMB 60,596,361.79 of the total came from donations, a year-on-year decrease of 14%. Investment went well too, second only to donations. The new revenue from fee for service amounted to RMB 954,030.60.

The total expenditure in 2020 was RMB 58,333,621.54, down by 6% over the year before. Program cost added up to RMB 52,353,449.80, and administration RMB 3,834,217.37.






As they play a leading role in the training system, the trainers need to put continuous efforts into professional development and capacity building to ensure training and program quality.

Chunhui Children's three core programs target orphaned children in welfare institutions and left-behind children in rural areas.

By the end of 2020, Chunhui's footprint had covered all $\overline{31}$ provinces, autonomous regions and municipalities across China. $\overline{71\%}$ of state-run child welfare institutions in China had partnered with Chunhui Children. $\overline{63,000}$ child caregivers in welfare institutions had been trained and a total of over 200,000 children had been directly benefited, including $\overline{178,000}$ orphaned children of Chunhui Mama Program, $\overline{3,200}$ children of Care Home Program and over $\overline{21,000}$ left-behind children of Chunhui Village program.



Orphanage Model

Maternal Love for Orphaned Children
Science-based Loving
Care and Companionship

Operated by Chunhui Children in state-run welfare institutions, Chunhui Mama is a child care and education program designed for orphaned and special needs children aged 0-18. This comprehensive program adheres to the concepts of Chunhui Children's inclusive education, takes into account the developmental characteristics of children at different ages, integrates the responsive and inclusive education curriculum of rehabilitation and special education, and designs individualized teaching content and methods, thus creating educational opportunities suitable for each child and promoting their holistic development. The program trains thousands of front-line Chunhui Mamas to provide responsive care for orphaned children, develop secure attachments with them and pay consistent attention to their needs. In doing so, the children can thrive in family-like love and care. Chunhui Mama is not only a name for one of our programs but also the title for the thousands of women working with our programs in welfare institutions. They serve two roles, as the children's "mamas," and as their teachers. There are five sub-programs in Chunhui Mama, including Chunhui Infant Nurture, Chunhui Preschool, Chunhui Youth, Chunhui Family and Chunhui Training.





2020 Program Data

In 2020, Chunhui Children ran Chunhui Mama Program in 55 welfare institutions. 9,709 orphaned children were directly benefited and over 50,000 children were impacted. 2,171 front-line child caregivers were trained and over 40,000 adults were impacted. As of 2020, an accumulative total of 178,000 children had been directly benefited and 320,000 children had been impacted; an accumulative total of 25,000 orphanage child caregivers had been trained and 390,000 adults impacted.

Sub Programs of Chunhui Mama Program



Caring women with appropriate professional backgrounds from the local community are recruited and trained to become full-time "Chunhui Mamas" who provide loving responsive care for orphaned babies and toddlers aged from birth to 3 years (4 years for children with special needs) and form secure attachments with them. "Chunhui Mamas" pay close attention to each child's needs and give timely and appropriate responses to those needs. They also provide vital brain stimulation, nurturing care and a variety of age-appropriate games for children with special needs to promote their physical, language, cognitive and social-emotional development.

In 2020, Chunhui Infant Nurture Program was operated in 39 welfare institutions, with 962 infants and toddlers directly benefited and 268 Chunhui mamas trained.



Chunhui Preschool serves children aged 3-7 in welfare institutions by creating supportive environment and running individualized classes based on each child's developmental levels and interests. Professionally trained preschool teachers use responsive education concepts to run emergent classes and integrated classes. The internationally recognized emergent classes empower children as active learners. Integrated classes design individualized teaching plans for children with different levels of special needs to help them develop their fullest potentials. Chunhui Preschool aims to promote children's physical, language, cognitive, and social-emotional development, help them develop a love for learning, and prepare them for elementary or special education schools.

In 2020, Chunhui Preschool Program was operated in $\overline{37}$ welfare institutions, with 884 children directly benefited and 240 preschool teachers trained.



hunhui Youth Chunhui Youth is designed to serve 7-18-year-old children with two sub-programs. The Youth Tutoring & Support Sub Program is tailored for school-aged children. Well-trained loving mentors spend time with the children after school, learn about their needs, personalities and interests, provide for them necessary emotional support, make individualized teaching and support plans, and help them develop self-awareness, build self-confidence and self-esteem. The Youth Integration Education Sub Program serves orphanage children attending special education schools and children who cannot participate in any forms of learning due to their physical impairment. This sub program provides child-centered sports and rehabilitation & special education integrated courses for these children based on their ability levels, needs and age groups. The goal is to promote their all-round development.

In 2020, Chunhui Youth Tutoring and Support Program was operated in 22 welfare institutions, directly benefiting youths and providing training for 33 youth mentors.

Chunhui Education Integration Sub Program (Sports) was operated in 23 welfare institutions, directly benefiting 817 youths, and providing training for 84 teachers.

Chunhui Education Integration Sub Program (Rehabilitation integration) was operated in $\frac{29}{65}$ welfare institutions, directly benefiting $\frac{765}{65}$ children, and providing training for $\frac{203}{600}$ teachers.



Families have always been the best way we have to raise our young children. Chunhui Family Program recruits married couples from the local community who receive our professional training and then set up loving foster homes for children with special needs to grow up with familial love. Each family includes a trained full-time mom and a working dad who take care of 3-5 children unlikely to be adopted. The families live in apartments provided by the welfare institutions.

In 2020, Chunhui Family Program was operated in 24 welfare institutions, with 217 foster mothers trained and 780 children directly benefited.



To meet the pressing needs of welfare institutions for quality child care and to ultimately reach more orphaned children in need, Chunhui Children delivers both on-site and online training for institution administrators, caregivers, teachers and foster parents in welfare institutions.

In 2020, a total of 9 training sessions were held and 1,108 trainees from 96 welfare institutions attended the sessions.

Chunhui mamas give orphaned children motherly love

2020 was the 20th anniversary of Chunhui Mama Program. In the past two decades, Chunhui Children reached out to more welfare institutions and its program models kept perfecting. As an increasing share of orphanage children suffered from severe special needs, Chunhui Children rolled out rehabilitation & special education integration programs inspired by the "life-long management of the whole child" philosophy in welfare institutions above city level. Acclaimed by partner welfare institutions and government agencies, the proven Chunhui Mama Program was conferred "China Charity Award" by the Ministry of Civil Affairs.






Medical Model for Orphaned Children

Professional Medical Care
Help Orphaned Children Overcome
Serious Illness

Chunhui Care Home (CCH) partners with welfare institutions in China to bring infants and toddlers born with life-threatening diseases and defects to Beijing, Shanghai and Guangzhou for the best medical treatment available. Working with the institutions and China's top hospitals, CCH covers all areas of the children's medical treatment including pre-operative check, hospitalization, surgery and other care. In partnership with the Tomorrow Plan, administered by the Ministry of Civil Affairs, the program each year serves more than 200 children fighting for their lives. We train full-time loving Chunhui Mamas to patiently provide the best follow-up care and emotional support so the children can recover, return to the institutions and find a permanent adoptive family at the earliest possible date.





2020 Program Data:

In 2020, 242 children from 78 welfare institutions were admitted by Chunhui Care Home. In the past 11 years, the program partnered with a total of 288 institutions, served 3,200 children, and trained 265 Chunhui mamas. Heart defects, cleft lip and palate, meningomyelocele were the top three diseases afflicting the children but now deformities, general surgery and heart disease dominate.

Beijing Chunhui Care Home was set up in May 2009 to provide professional medical service and family-like care for orphanage children who come to Beijing for live-saving surgeries. Over a dozen of years, it has amassed rich experience and set up a network of medical care services for the children before and after a surgery. In order to reach more orphanage children in South and East China, Chunhui Care Home was duplicated in Shanghai in May 2019 and Guangzhou in November 2020.

Additionally, local Chunhui mamas in Changsha, Xi'an and Nanchang cities were trained to provide nursing care for the children hospitalized for a surgery funded by the provincial "Tomorrow Plan". Chunhui Care Home Program has run for 10 years, during which, it has continued to explore and now has transformed from single treatment of some orphaned children in welfare institutions to setting up a medical aid service system for the orphaned.




Village Model

Improve Skills of Child Caregivers
Promote Holistic Early Development
of Rural Left-behind Children

Chunhui Village is an early childhood development program specially designed for rural left-behind children and their caregivers. It focuses on the early learning and development of children aged 0-6, responding to their needs and interest, and allowing them to develop in their own ways. By putting together the resources of families, schools and communities, we set up Children's Centers that provide family skills training, reading and community engagement opportunities. We are committed to creating a nurturing community environment that helps unleash the children's fullest potential and fuels their physical, language, cognitive, and social-emotional development. The program also addresses the needs of children and adolescents aged 7-18. It provides them with interest development, games, reading and learning opportunities in a safe environment that help them develop their own hobbies, build self-esteem and confidence while improving abilities to build relationships and adapt. By home visiting and following up on children with special needs, it offers them extra necessary support.

Chunhui Village Program PART 3 Program Update





2020 Program Data

Since it was launched in Ye County of Henan Province in 2015, Chunhui Village Program has been run in a total of $\frac{5}{7}$ villages, benefiting $\frac{21,600}{600}$ children and their families. $\frac{60\%}{600}$ of the children are left behind by one or two parents migrating to big cities for better employment opportunities. Two county-level training and early learning centers were set up, which have trained $\frac{559}{12,829}$ left-behind children, trained $\frac{124}{12000}$ teachers and $\frac{74}{12000}$ child directors, provided $\frac{850}{12000}$ public family skills training sessions, facilitated $\frac{5000}{12000}$ home visits and $\frac{7000}{12000}$ community engagement activities.

Chunhui Village Program has been operated for five years. The four-year program evaluation completed by China Development and Research Foundation shows that the children have made strides in physical and social-emotional development, and improved in problem-solving, learning, writing and language skills. The change of child care models has contributed to the children's all-round development as well. 84% of the caregivers have used what they learned from the training into their work with the children. These parents and grandparents stay connected and gentle with their children rather than give criticisms as they did

before. The caregivers' child care skills progressed, and the program children have easier access to toys, learning materials and emotional support than the non-program control group of children.

Chunhui Village Program has three strengths. Responsive care & education replaced conventional child care models. The program is rooted in rural communities and confronts tough problems head on. Training is provided for grass-root child welfare officials, local resources is pooled, and local teachers are cultivated to help the government reach underprivileged children in the most "out-of-the-way" areas.






Fee for Service

In 2020, Chunhui Children provided professional service for $\frac{9}{9}$ government-funded programs, including a model one funded by the central government. By Dec 31, 2020, Chunhui Children had received a total revenue of RMB $\frac{5,060,000}{9}$ and established partnership with $\frac{24}{9}$ welfare institutions.



Evaluation

In 2020, Chunhui Children rolled out 3 massive evaluations: psychological well-being and home visit evaluation of community-based orphaned children and de facto unattended children in Tongren City, Guizhou Province (August); psychological health and life quality evaluation of community-based orphaned children and de facto unattended children in Ganzhou City, Jiangxi Province; a look-back at the psychological well-being of orphaned children in welfare institutions of Guizhou Province. In 2020, Chunhui Children's training teams reached out to 22 counties under Ganzhou city (Jiangxi Province), Tongren city (Guizhou Province), and 25 child welfare institutions across Guizhou, where they evaluated a total of 2,170 children and paid home visits to 441 families. By evaluating these children, Chunhui Children learned about the plight of disadvantaged children and the implementation of child protection policy in these jurisdictions. Based on what they found out, the evaluation teams submitted 3 evaluation overviews and 7 comprehensive reports.



Partners:











Partnership Exploration:

In 2020, Chunhui Children piloted live-stream program promotion and fundraising at such platforms as Taobao, Alipay and Tencent—KanDian (Hot news). Views of the live streams hit 200,000 and thumb-ups 400,000. During the Sept 5 Philanthropy Week and the Sept 9 Giving Day events, Chunhui Children's partner pop stars all voiced for our programs. Also in September, China's leading ride-hailing firm Didi Chuxing initiated a campaign to provide Chunhui Mamas with easier free rides. An H5 was designed for the campaign, which registered million views on Tencent platform, WeChat moments, and DIDI APP.

Fundraising Events:

In early 2020, on the platform jointly set up by YOUKU, Xianyu and Alibaba, a host of stars had their selected belongings sold to support Chunhui Children. The fund raised all went to COVID-19 prevention supplies for Chunhui's partner welfare institutions. With the support of Taobao and Alibaba Philanthropy, Chunhui Children launched the event "What a Penny Can Do" on June 1st, Children's Day, and the event "A New Year Gift for You" at the end of 2020. Right before the 2021 New Year's Day, Chunhui Children ran an event themed "A Nuannuan for You, a Loving Home for the Children" in Beijing Fortune Plaza. The events all won a big support from the public.

Taobao Philanthropy Items:

Throughout 2020, Chunhui Children's campaign "Chunhui Mamas Give Orphaned Children a Second Chance at Childhood" raised a total fund of RMB 6,250,000 from Alibaba online platform. In October, the campaign was enrolled into Alibaba's "On-Chain Philanthropy", a plan designed to make charity programs more transparent and more accessible to the wider public.



一、审计意见

我们审计了北京春晖博爱儿童救助公益基金会(以下简称春晖博爱基金会)财 务报表,包括2020年12月31日的资产负债表,2020年度的业务活动表,现金流量表及 财务报表附注。

我们认为, 春晖博爱基金会在所有重大方面按照《民间非营利组织会计制度》 的规定编制,公允反映了春晖博爱基金会2020年12月31日的财务状况以及2020年度 的业务活动成果和现金流量。

二、形成审计意见的基础

我们按照中国注册会计师审计准则的规定执行了审计工作。审计报告的"注册 会计师对财务报表审计的责任"部分进一步阐述了我们在这些准则下的责任。按照 中国注册会计师职业道德守则,我们独立于春晖博爱基金会,并履行了职业道德方 面的其他责任。我们相信,我们获取的审计证据是充分、适当的,为发表审计意见 提供了基础。

三、管理层和治理层对财务报表的责任

编制和公允列报财务报表是春晖博爱基金会管理层的责任,这种责任包括:(1) 按照《民间非营利组织会计制度》的规定编制财务报表,并使其实现公允反映;(2) 设计、执行和维护必要的内部控制,以使财务报表不存在由于舞弊或错误导致的重 大错报。

四、注册会计师对财务报表审计的责任

我们的目标是对财务报表整体是否不存在由于舞弊或错误导致的重大错报获取 合理保证, 并出具包含审计意见的审计报告。合理保证是高水平的保证, 但并不能 保证按照审计准则和《基金会财务报表审计指引》执行的审计在某一重大错报存在 时总能发现。错报可能由于舞弊或错误导致,如果合理预期错报单独或汇总起来可 能影响财务报表使用者依据财务报表作出的经济决策,则通常认为错报是重大的。

在按照审计准则和《基金会财务报表审计指引》执行审计工作的过程中,我们 运用职业判断,并保持职业怀疑。同时,我们也执行以下工作:

我们与治理层就计划的审计范围、时间安排和重大审计发现等事项进行沟通, 包括沟通我们在审计中识别出的值得关注的内部控制缺陷。
