1.1 Message from Our Board Chairman and CEO





2021 was a year of love

Covid-19 flared up from time to time. To ensure the wellbeing of the 50,000 orphaned children under their care, the state-run child welfare institutions (CWIs) across China played it safe throughout the year. 901 Chunhui Mamas of our partner CWIs spent most of their time staying with the children in the institutions and minimized their time outside. The institution administrators and staff worked in shifts to contain entry and exit frequency. All the field trainers of Chunhui Children were required to show their nucleic acid test result and 14-day travel record before entering an institution. Program guidance was provided both online and offline. The second year into the pandemic, all Chunhui Mamas, the children under their care and the institutions were still adapting. While learning to live with the pandemic, they forged ahead hand in hand. With a caring adult always by their side, not a single child was affected.

2021 was a year of innovation

For the first time ever, Chunhui Children reached out to at-risk children. In line with China's national rejuvenation strategy, it brought its five years' experience of working with left-behind children in central China to a poverty-ridden western province. In that province, it duplicated its village program for children born into disadvantaged families so as to prevent any of them from experiencing what Liu Xuezhou had gone through (Liu Xuezhou was a boy abandoned by his birth parents, adopted, bullied in school, abandoned again, and finally committed suicide at 15 years of age.)

There are roughly 6.9 million at-risk children in China who have been living in a deprived environment because of their severe diseases, lack of guardianship or other special needs. Chunhui Children provides for its program's children emotional, social and academic support, and delivers home visits, games, salons and group activities to build up their confidence. Besides, it promotes family education and works with the communities to create a nurturing environment for the children to flourish. Evaluation results show that within just one year, the program helped almost 5,000 at-risk children improve their social-emotional skills and regain hope for life.

2021 was a year of cooperation

In June, China's national minor protection law was officially put into effect. Chunhui Children joined hands with Guizhou province, Jiangxi province and Tongzhou District of Beijing to create a minor protection system for underprivileged children living in the most out-of-the-way regions (the last mileages). On the one hand, Chunhui Village Program looked into the family guardianship status of the most disadvantaged children, evaluated guardianship risks, identified high-risk children and provided them with necessary follow-up intervention and care. On the other hand, it doubled down on efforts to bring governmental and social attention to these children and promote government-society joint endeavor in creating a minor protection network. The goal of the program is to offer high-risk children quality service and a chance at a bright future. This will make a big difference to the at-risk minors and their families.

2021 was a year of achievements

Chunhui Children's 2021 was successful. It dreamed big and delivered bigger. Looking forward, it will continue to do everything in its capacity for every child it serves so that they all have someone in their life that keeps them looking forward to the next day.



Chunhui Children's Foundation ("Chunhui Children" for short) was registered in Beijing in 2012 and became a public fundraising foundation in 2017. Chunhui Children recruits front-line caregivers and teachers and trains them to provide consistent family-like love and science-based, child-centered education for orphaned children in welfare institutions, left-behind children in villages and at-risk children in impoverished communities. In 2015 and 2020, it was rated as "5A" social organization (the highest rating). In 2020, it was granted the 11th China Charity Award and special consultative status with the ECOSOC, UN.

At present, Chunhui Children runs three core programs for orphaned children, rural left-behind children and at-risk children. The three programs are: Chunhui Mama, Chunhui Care Home and Chunhui Village.





2021 Revenue Composition

The total revenue in 2021 was RMB 43,970,603.06, down by 39% over the previous year. Out of this revenue, RMB 42,034,463.84 came from donations, a year-on-year decrease of 31%, and RMB 1,193,070.40 came from fee for service programs, a year-on-year increase of 25%. 



His research interests include the effects of early institutionalization on growth and development and the outcomes of internationally adopted children, which makes him a well-known expert of the field worldwide. He received the Distinguished Service Award and the Lifetime Achievement Award from Joint Council for International Children's Services and the Harry Holt Award from Holt International. Currently he serves on the Board of Directors of the Joint Council on International Children's Services, Half the Sky Foundation and SPOON Foundation.



Janice N. Cotton,

Ph.D., Early Child Education, Senior Consultant of HTS

Janice Cotton holds a Master Degree of Science from Samford University, and a Ph.D. from the University of Alabama in Birmingham. She has over 35 years of experience in education. She worked as a teacher at preschool education institutions and primary schools, and as Director of Infant Education at a public school in Birmingham. She also worked at the University of Alabama to create and evaluate educational programs for children and their families. Janice joined Half the Sky (now OneSky) in 2001, and served as Director of the Infant Nurture program and Chief Program Office. She retired in 2020, and is now Senior Consultant of OneSky.

Program Concepts

All of Chunhui Children's programs embrace integrated education inclusive of all children (based on "life-long management of the whole child" philosophy). The programs pay attention to each child's needs and care about his/her life quality. Chunhui Children develops its inclusive education approaches based on the children's developmental levels, and creates equal educational opportunities that are appropriate for each child and responsive to his/her individual needs.



Core Principles

Responsive Care

Chunhui Children's professionally trained caregivers observe, interpret and respond to the individual needs of each child and meet those needs in a timely and appropriate manner that promotes children's healthy and holistic development.

Secure Attachment

trusting relationship cultivated by a loving caregiver who consistently, promptly and appropriately responds to a child's needs. It is this attachment that gives the child security, and provides him/her with the skills and capacity to build stable social and emotional relationships with others and promotes healthy development.

Nurturing Learning Environment

A caregiver must identify the children's interests and developmental needs in order to create a fun, safe and enriching learning environment for them. The children can have diverse learning experiences in this environment and thus develop to their fullest potential.

Chunhui Children's three core programs target orphaned children in welfare institutions, left-behind children in villages and at-risk children in impoverished communities. By the end of 2021, Chunhui Children had partnered with 71% of all state-run CWIs in 31 provinces, autonomous regions and municipalities of China, benefiting a total of over 210,000 children, including 180,000 orphaned children with the Chunhui Mama Program, 30,000 left-behind and at-risk children with the Chunhui Village Program and 3,485 children with the Care Home Program. 69,000 child caregivers in welfare institutions had been trained.



Orphanage Model

Maternal Love for Orphaned Children
Science-based Loving Care and Companionship

Operated by Chunhui Children in state-run welfare institutions, Chunhui Mama is a childcare and education program designed for orphaned and special needs children aged 0-18. This program embraces inclusive education (inspired by the "life-long management of the whole child" philosophy) and designs individualized teaching plans based on each child's developmental needs. It aims to create educational opportunities for each child and promote his/her holistic development. And it trains thousands of front-line Chunhui Mamas to provide responsive care for orphaned children, develop secure attachment with them and pay consistent attention to their needs. With Chunhui Mamas by their side, the children have an opportunity to survive and thrive. Chunhui Mama is not only a program name but also the title for the thousands of women working with our programs in welfare institutions. They serve two roles, as the children's "mamas," and as their teachers.

2021 Program Data

In 2021, Chunhui Children runs the Chunhui Mama Program in 48 welfare institutions. 4,961 orphaned children were directly benefited and over 50,000 children were impacted. 1,136 front-line child caregivers were trained and over 40,000 adults were impacted. As of 2021, an accumulative total of 179,955 children were directly benefited and 346,000 children were impacted; an accumulative total of 26,293 orphanage child caregivers were trained and 430,000 adults were impacted.

3.2 Chunhui Mama Program

Sub Programs of the Chunhui Mama Program

Caring women with appropriate professional backgrounds from the local community are recruited and trained to become full-time "Chunhui Mamas" who provide loving responsive care for orphaned babies and toddlers aged from birth to 3 years (4 years for children with special needs) and form secure attachments with them. "Chunhui Mamas" pay close attention to each child's needs, and give timely and appropriate responses to those needs. They also provide vital brain stimulation, nurturing care and a variety of age-appropriate games for children with special needs to promote their physical, language, cognitive and social-emotional development.

Chunhui Preschool serves children aged 3-7 in welfare institutions by creating supportive environments and running individualized classes based on each child's developmental levels and interests. Professionally trained preschool teachers use responsive education concepts to run emergent courses and inclusive courses. The internationally recognized emergent classes empower children as active learners. Individualized teaching plans are developed to help each child unleash his/her fullest potentials. Chunhui Preschool aims to promote children's physical, language, cognitive, and social-emotional development, help them develop a love for learning, and prepare them for elementary or special education schools

The program is designed to serve 7-18-year-old children with two sub-programs. The Youth Tutoring & Support sub program is tailored for school-aged children. Well-trained loving mentors spend time with the children after school, learn about their needs and interests, provide for them necessary emotional support, engage them in individualized learning, and help them develop positive self-image, self-confidence, and self-esteem. The Youth Integrated Education sub program serves orphanage children attending special education schools and children who cannot participate in any forms of learning due to their physical impairment. It provides child-centered sports and rehabilitation & special education integrated courses for these children based on their ability levels, needs and age groups.

Families have always been the best way we have to raise our young children. The Chunhui Family Program recruits married couples from the local community who receive our professional training and then set up loving foster homes for children with special needs to grow up with familial love. Each family includes a trained full-time mom and a working dad who together take care of 3-5 children unlikely to be adopted. The families live in apartments provided by the welfare institutions.

Chunhui Mama Program Promoted Rehabilitation & Special Education Integration

Since 2017, Chunhui Children has piloted rehabilitation & special education integration in Nanjing, Nanchang and Beihai CWIs. It has worked with the child nurture, special education, rehabilitation, and medical treatment departments of these institutions to draw up individualized development plans and design rehabilitation courses for each child based on his/her ability levels, needs and ages. While giving a strong impetus to the children's all-round development, the program has improved the institutions' resource consolidation ability and service professionalism. The Chunhui Youth Program director offered the front-line teachers and mentors multiple trainings on what is essential for rehabilitation & special education integration, how to teach children with severe special needs, and how to work with individual cases on a daily basis. The trainers developed a detailed and feasible rehabilitation & special education integration plan that would be implemented across the country. Each trainer would try out the plan with one of the programs under her charge and then promote it among other programs. As the concepts, resource integration ability and service professionalism vary with different CWIs, it will take some time for the plan to roll out across the country.

In 2021, based on its proven practices in running rehabilitation & special education courses, Chunhui Children drafted the Standards on Rehabilitation & Special Education Integration in CWIs which, if approved, will serve as China's national standards



Medical Model for Orphaned Children

Professional Medical Care
Helping Orphaned Children Overcome Serious Illness

Chunhui Care Home (CCH) partners with welfare institutions in China to bring infants and toddlers born with life-threat-ening diseases and birth defects to Beijing, Shanghai and Guangzhou for the best medical treatment available. Working with the institutions and China's top hospitals, CCH offers the children a full spectrum of service including hospital registration, pre-surgery physical examination, hospitalization, pre/post-surgery care and discharge. In partnership with the Tomorrow Plan, administered by the Ministry of Civil Affairs, the program each year serves more than 200 children fighting for their lives. We train full-time loving Chunhui Mamas to patiently provide the best follow-up care and emotional support so the children can recover, return to their institution, and find a permanent adoptive family at the earliest possible date.

2021 Program Data

In 2021, 285 children from 79 welfare institutions were admitted by the Chunhui Care Home. 214 surgeries were completed and 152 children had remote consultation with medical specialists in Beijing, Shanghai and Guangzhou. From the day it was set up till the end of 2021, the program accumulatively served 3,485 orphaned children with severe diseases from a total of 300 institutions, facilitated 3,128 surgeries, trained 274 Chunhui Mamas and partnered with 56 hospitals.

New Breakthroughs

After half a year's preparation and renovation, Guangzhou CCH was put into trial operation and welcomed its first group of children and Chunhui Mamas on July 1, 2021. With 20 beds available, the Home allows the children to access to superior medical resources in South China and provides them with round-the-clock pre/post-surgical care.

Also in 2021, the program started exploring a model of services for at-risk children.

Chunhui Village is a charitable program specially designed for left-behind children and at-risk children. In partnership with local governments, Chunhui Children creates child centers, and recruits, trains and empowers local child workers. Equipped with professional concepts and approaches, these child workers evaluate 0-18-year-old left-behind children and at-risk children, provide them and their families with such services as family education, community engagement opportunities and emotional support. The program goal is to create a child-centered nurturing community environment that helps the children grow into confident, powerful and responsible adults.

2021 Program Data

In 2021, the program benefited 12,180 left-behind children and 4,619 at-risk children, trained 142 local child workers and provided individualized service for 95 children. Program trainings and activities racked up a total attendance of 20,000 parents. From the year (2015) it was set up in Henan province to the end of 2021, the program served more than 30,000 children in 67 villages, 4 resettlement areas and 2 county-level child welfare institutions (also minor protection centers) of 2 provinces.

At-risk Minor Protection System

As a charitable organization committed to child welfare for years, Chunhui Children has developed a proven and duplicable village model. It draws on its professionalism in child work and family education to bolster partner county-level CWIs' transition into minor protection centers.

In March 2021, Guizhou Provincial Civil Affairs Office designated Chunhui Children as its sole partner in piloting its minor protection projects. Chunhui Children reached out to 5,000 at-risk children in the two county-level CWIs and 4 resettlement areas of Jiangkou and Yanhe counties, Tongren City. It set up township-level child centers in the resettlement areas and developed professional child workers, who delivered a full range of services including guardianship risk evaluation, home visits, individualized support and enriching community engagement activities so as to build a nurturing community environment for the at-risk children and their families. In August 2021, Chunhui Children worked with Yanhe Civil Affairs Administration to roll out its village model in 10 villages of the county. With all these Chunhui programs in place, Yanhe county's three-level (village, township and county levels) minor protection system started to take shape. Powerful policy support and quality services would be accessible to the at-risk minors.



Family First Program

In Sept. 2021, Chunhui Children and CCCWA(China Center for Children's Welfare and Adoption) signed a three-year Family First Program contract. The program aims to promote the service quality and transition of CWIs across China. In alignment with the *CWI Social Service Standards* issued by the MCA (Ministry of Civil Affairs), it will put in place intensive training, follow-up on-the-job training, on-site guidance, and consistent online mentoring.


Childcare & education professionals will work together to develop sector-leading standards on rehabilitation & special education integration for CWIs. Additionally, the program will design online training courses for foster parents.

Throughout 2021, the program kicked off $\frac{3}{5}$ training sessions for $\frac{160}{5}$ trainees, including institution directors, heads of social work departments and front-line staff from $\frac{173}{5}$ CWIs.

In 2021, recognizing its quality service and program achievements, more than 60% of Chunhui Children's partner institutions renewed their program contract with it.





Sweet Chunhui mama stories were shared and reposted by loving volunteers among the public, bringing Chunhui Mama Program rising popularity. On the "Sept 9 Giving Day", Chunhui Children held an H5 "drifting bottles of wishes for the children" event online, and meanwhile had charity sales in Beijing Fortune Plaza and LEGOLAND Discovery Center Beijing to raise funds for the children.



During 2021 Spring Festival, China's ride-share giant DiDi unveiled its "2021 Spring Festival Plan" to support medical staff staying on duty even amid pandemic resurgence. The Plan provided free rides for mamas and children of Chuihui Care Home, and shot videos of their travels to and from the hospitals. On December 2, China's Traffic Safety Day, DIDI helped raise funds for CCH too.

In 2021, despite the ravaging pandemic, loving companies and foundations donated over RMB 20 million to Chunhui Children.


